Jackson Hole Fire/EMS is asking for \$6,800,000 for the purpose of funding the renovation, construction and seismic upgrades to Fire Station #1 (Jackson) and to fund the acquisition of land, easements, and the planning/engineering of a new Fire Station #3 (Hoback). This project is sponsored by Teton County.

Teton County voters will have an opportunity to vote on each proposal in a special election on Tuesday, May 2nd, 2017, or prior to that via absentee voting, which begins on March 23rd, 2017.

OUT OF TOWN ON MAY 2ND?

Absentee voting begins Thursday, March 23rd at the Teton County Administration Building located at 200 E. Simpson. Absentee voting will be open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
