The Town of Jackson Community Streets Plan identifies that streets shall be designed and constructed to enable safe, convenient, year-round pedestrian access to local destinations for people of all ages and abilities. This funding will allow the Town of Jackson (Public Works Department) to provide safe connections to schools, housing, local businesses, and new developments around town. Projects will be identified from the Town's capital improvement list and through public input.

WHAT IS PROPOSED

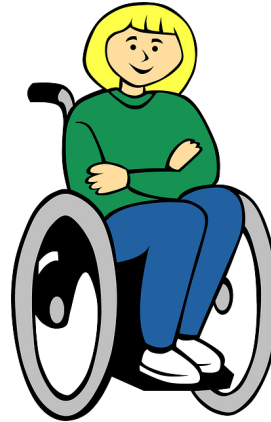


Sidewalks

This SPET initiative will allow the Town to install sidewalks to connect areas with gaps in our pedestrian network. These gaps not only create unsafe conditions for accessing schools, local businesses, and housing, but create mobility barriers for the most vulnerable members of our community, including seniors, young people, and people with disabilities.

Crosswalks

Funding will also be considered for capital expenses related to crosswalk improvements. Long-lasting, high-visibility crosswalks (either painted stripes or constructed in pavers) provide added safety for pedestrians, especially in high traffic areas.



ADA Accessibility

Additionally, this funding will allow the Town to address current sidewalk areas that do not meet accessibility (ADA) requirements, providing equal access to more areas of Town for all members of our community.

WHAT IS THE COST

Through the Community Streets Plan process and the Capital Improvement Plan, the Town of Jackson has identified numerous areas where new sidewalks are needed or existing sidewalks are poorly designed. Funding this initiative will be a step towards addressing some of the more than \$5M in deficiencies and gaps in our pedestrian network, and will allow the Town to prioritize the work in the most needed areas in Town. The Community Streets Plan describes modern design guidelines that provide safe access for all users.
